About the Institute

The Maine Department of Education has approved the Institute to fulfill the requirement for a course on school law for purposes of administrator certification. Whether you need a course to satisfy a requirement, are looking for an update or simply have an interest in school law, the course will meet your needs. The course qualifies for C.E.U.s from USM for a small fee payable by check on the first day of the Institute. (**Note:** Although the Institute provides certification and recertification credits, it is not affiliated with a college or university and does not provide graduate school credits.)



More About the Institute

Required Texts

Maine School Law, 5th Edition, 2014, and Significant Cases in Maine School Law, 3rd Edition, 2013.

The appropriate texts and assigned topic for the first paper will be forwarded to each student by June 9.

Assignments, Readings, and First Paper

By the first class, students must read the assigned chapters and cases. **By July 18,** a paper (5 pages, double spaced, conventional type) will be due on an assigned question based on specific chapters and cases.

Individual Presentations

During the class sessions, each student will present a five-minute oral argument on one side of a legal decision from the customized case readings.

Participation

Spirited class discussion and active small group participation are essential parts of this Institute. Topic discussions will be interspersed with group assignments throughout the course.

Final Paper

A second paper (5 page maximum, double spaced, conventional type) will be due **by August 11**. The instructors will provide this assignment at the Institute.

Grading

Grades will be based on the papers, active class participation, the case arguments, and mock exercises.
